Organised by Women 1st, this annual event aims to recognise and celebrate female talent within the hospitality, passenger transport, travel and tourism sector. Breakfast Seminar - 17th November 2014 - Baroness Kramer

On Monday 17th November 2014, Women in Rail, in partnership with Westminster Advisers, hosted a breakfast seminar entitled, "Women in Transport – changing the perceptions of the industry". Baroness Susan Kramer, the Minister for Transport, was welcomed as our keynote speaker. Baroness Kramer spoke on the subject of gender imbalance across all transport sectors, what can be done to change perceptions in the rail industry and how we can drive the recruitment of women at all levels. She was very supportive of the work undertaken by Women in Rail, notably our initiatives to support women within the industry, including raising awareness of the benefits of gender diversity within the sector, as well as our campaign to showcase rail as an exciting career for the younger generations. The event took place at the Conrad London St James, Westminster and was attended by around 30 guests from across the rail and transport industry.

Joint University Presentation Programme (JUPP)

We now have confirmed dates for presentations with Aston, Huddersfield and Nottingham universities. We are also finalising dates with other universities to include Southampton, Reading and Birmingham. We will then look to engage with other universities so that we reach our target of 40 presentations in the 2014/15 academic year. Presentations will be taking place from October 2014 through to March 2015 in universities across the country. The standard format is for a 20 minute presentation followed by 40 minutes of Q&A/discussions, with the time of the presentation depending on the specific university's timetable. We are looking for more volunteers to present!
